Pursuant to a *General Order of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of New Jersey*, entered on March 27, 2002, the Court implemented Case Management/Electronic Case Filing ("CM/ECF") on April 1, 2002 (the "implementation date").

Pending a formal revision of the Court's Local Rules, in order to accommodate CM/ECF, effective October 1, 2002, the Court is modifying the requirements of D.N.J. LBR 5005-2, *Filing Papers - Numbers of Copies*, as follows:

Petitions, Statement of Financial Affairs and Schedules Filed Electronically

Chapters 7, 11, 12 and 13 - Submit only the original electronically filed Petition, Statement of Financial Affairs, and Schedules;

- CM/ECF Participant/filers will receive confirmation of the filing of the petition by the Notice of Electronic Filing (NEF);
- Copies of Petitions previously made available in hard copy to the Office of the United States Trustee, Chapter 7 Panel Trustee or Chapter 13 Standing Trustee, as well as to the public, will be available electronically through CM/ECF;

Petitions, Statement of Financial Affairs and Schedules Filed Conventionally

Chapters 7, 11, 12 and 13 - Submit original and one hard copy of the Petition, Statement of Financial Affairs, and Schedules;

- The "filed" hard copy of the petition will be returned to the filer;
- Copies of Petitions previously made available in hard copy to the Office of the United States Trustee, Chapter 7 Panel Trustee or Chapter 13 Standing Trustee, as well as to the public, will be available electronically through CM/ECF;

With respect to both electronically as well as conventionally filed Chapter 11 petitions, the Court will continue to comply with the notice requirements of Fed. R. Bankr.P.2002(j).
