RECORDS RETENTION

Please be advised that a revision to the records retention schedule for bankruptcy and adversary files has been approved by the Judicial Conference of the United States. Effective immediately:

General bankruptcy case files are retained for a 15 year interval. Presently, most of the 1970-1995 bankruptcy case files have been destroyed in accordance with their approved records disposition authority (N1-578-11-001, in accordance with 44 USC § 3303).

COMPLETE SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS

Reminder: Efiled petitions must be submitted with complete Social Security (SSN) or Individual Taxpayer Identification Numbers (ITIN). Failure to do so will delay the scheduling of a 341 meeting, and may result in dismissal of the debtor's case.

If a debtor does not have an SSN or ITIN, the debtor must complete a *Statement of Social Security Number* (Official Form B21). The form is available on the Court's web site, <u>www.njb.uscourts.gov</u>. The Statement must be efiled using the *Statement of Social Security Number* event, located in the Misc. Events category.

The purpose of this notice is to advise New Jersey Bankruptcy CM/ECF participants of new system and operational developments and to highlight issues that require immediate attention.

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MOTIONS FOR PAYMENT OF UNCLAIMED FUNDS

Pursuant to D.N.J. LBR 3011-1(b) all Motions for Payment of Unclaimed Funds filed in a closed case are heard by the Chief Judge. Efilers are reminded that when filing a Motion for Payment of Unclaimed Funds in a closed case they must select a hearing date, time and location for the Chief Judge on the hearing screen as shown below:

CM/ECF EVENT CHANGES

The **Application for Compensation** event (Motions/Applications category; Compensation event) has been modified as follows:

During the event the user is prompted to answer the question: Is the amount of fees requested, excluding expenses \$1000 or under?.

Is the amount of fees requested, excluding expenses \$ 1000 or under? O Yes O No

The user MUST select Yes or No. Failure to do so will prevent the user from advancing to the next screen.

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TECH TALK

EFILERS USING MAC'S - The court is experiencing difficulty viewing some PDF forms completed using the built-in Mac PDF viewer. Specifically, the Mac user is able to see the information entered in the form fields; however court users see blank fields.

Our systems department suggests that efilers who use MAC computers, and who have encountered this issue, try the one of the following fixes:

- Install the latest version of Adobe Reader, currently XI, or
- Upgrade to the latest Mac operating system, currently OS X Mountain Lion.



Internet Explorer & Compatibility Mode – The court has received many help desk calls from users who are unable to access our online CM/ECF User's Guide. The latest versions of Internet Explorer have a feature called "compatibility mode." If you are attempting to access our User's Guide and are presented with a blank screen, click on the compatibility mode icon as show below. Doing so should open the Guide. If you continue to experience problems, please contact the Help Desk.



For user's who are unfamiliar with the Court's CM/ECF User's Guide – it contains detailed instructions for efiling many documents, from Adversary Complaints to Voluntary Petitions and hundreds of documents in between . The Guide can be accessed by clicking on "For Attorneys" on our web site, and then selecting CM/ECF User's Guide.


Clearing Cache - "Cache" is a computer term for files stored in temporary folders that help make navigation of the internet faster. From time to time, efilers may experience a problem seeing all categories or links in CM/ECF. Often, the reason for this is your cache is full. If you encounter this problem please take the following steps to "clear your cache."

Internet Explorer 10 (IE10)

- Step 1 Open Internet Explorer
- Step 2 Click **Tools** on the pull-down menu
- Step 3 Select Delete Browsing History
- Step 4 Ensure all boxes are checked; click **DELETE**
- Step 5 Close and reopen Internet Explorer

Mozilla Firefox 22.0

- Step 1 Open Firefox
- Step 2 Click **Tools** on the pull-down menu
- Step 3 Select Options
- Step 4.a Select the Advanced icon
- Step 4.b Select the **Network** tab
- Step 5 Click the CLEAR NOW button shown below
- Step 6 Click OK
- Step 7 Close and reopen Firefox

Pop-Up Blockers – Efilers are reminded that they must enable their pop-up blocker when filing a document that requires the payment of a fee. The following steps illustrate turning off a browser's pop-up blocker functions.

Internet Explorer 10 (IE10)


- Step 1 Click the **Tools** pull down menu
- STEP 2 Select Pop-Up Blocker

STEP 3 Click Turn Off Pop-Up Blocker

- Step 1 Click the **Tools** drop-down menu
- Step 2 Select **Options**
- Step 3 Click the **Contents** icon
- Step 4.a Click the checkbox next to "Block pop-up windows
- Step 4.b Click the Exceptions button



Step 5 Enter **ecf.njb.uscourts.gov** in the Address field; click **Allow**
