In order to accommodate CM/ECF, the Court further entered an Order on or about March 27, 2002 requiring that all proposed forms of order submitted subsequent to the implementation date, whether submitted electronically or conventionally, must substantially conform with the order template and accompanying directions maintained by the Court, and made available on the court's web site www.ni.uscourts.gov.

Specifically, as provided by the Court's Administrative Procedures for Filing, Signing, and Verifying Documents by Electronic Means (the "Administrative Procedures"), at paragraph II. E. 3, all proposed forms of order, whether submitted electronically or conventionally, shall be formatted in accordance with instructions provided by the Clerk. The Commentary Supplementing the Administrative Procedures at paragraph II. 5 provides:

Any proposed form of order whether submitted electronically or conventionally, must substantially conform with the order templates maintained by the Court, and made available on the Court's website www.njb.ucourts.gov.
